On Thursday we are leaving for Kabwe to attend a ProChristo Mission Conference. Kabwe is just south of Kapiri Mposhi for those of you with a map. Some of you will probably remember we visited a Canadian couple there a few weeks ago, who is also setting up an orphanage. ProChristo is an international Mission Organisation which was founded by a South African – Frans Hancke. He wrote a book "Onverantwoordelik" which is well worth a read. Coen Scholtz is our contact at ProChristo and he is also the guy that has helped us so much with the container. It will be due to him and Herman Bosman if the container gets to us!

On one of the pictures you have Shipego and Chimonja busy watering the newly planted beds. There are beds and beds and beds to water! As far as the eye can see, there are beds with vegetables – even in my "front garden"!

We are really getting on with the building of the bathrooms. The foundations are finished and the septic tank and drains have been dug. On the photo you will see Lourie and his
