On the left is Frank and Nita de Atouguia from the SA Congregation in the UK. They came to say hello for a few days while doing an extensive 4x4 safari through Africa. Here they are helping with the preparation of food for the Saturday orphan feeding programme.

We also had a group from the Reformed Church in Kathu (South Africa). They blessed us with a biltong-potjie on the first night, which we thoroughly enjoyed! Biltong (beef jerky) is an all time favourite snack for South Africans.

Gert vd Berg and his two sons, Gert jnr. and Johan, did some electrical wiring for us. They did a great job with the electrical wiring for the computer room as well as one of the smaller houses.

Koos, Gerda, Hardy and Nerine Kruger helped us with the baby feeding programme and other programmes. Nerine who is finishing her dental studies in the next year assisted Lourie with the dental clinic.

They also helped very enthusiastically with the handing out of jerseys and uniforms. The need is just so big and everyone is just so thankful for even the smallest gesture of goodwill.
