This was a week of stresses and strains but we are Kings Kids as you can see on the photo, therefore we have FAVOUR!

To begin with, the borehole company only turned up on Tuesday to come and flush the borehole. These are the same people who drilled the hole – more than 18 months ago. We knew from the beginning they wouldn't do it for nothing – the standard quote to flush a borehole is 7,5 million kwachas (more or less R15 000/£1000) BUT if you do not have water, this is a small price to pay, I assure you!

They started by demolishing the pump house to get access to the borehole. After a huge struggle to get the machine set up on top of the borehole they started flushing. We were extremely excited because with our new generator AND a clean bore hole we would have fresh water at last.

At 17:30 (dark already!) as the very last pipe was coming out . . . lo and behold, it caught the edge of the casing and needless to say, they had to replace the whole casing. The boss rang to say the costs would be 10 million now, but they won't be able to do this before the next day (which was yesterday). At this stage we realised that ONLY a miracle could help us! Yesterday they started the new hole about a meter from the previous one. At 18:00 the boss rang to discuss the costs. He asked Lourie how much we would be willing to pay. Lourie (very brave!) said ONE million kwachas. The man then said, what about 2 million (!). Lourie then pushed his luck and said , OK one and a half. Deal clenched. A few minutes later the phone rang again – it was the boss again. He said he had just spoken to Mrs Russel (owner) and she is willing to donate it to the

Hulle het geen krag nie, en die onderwysers moet almal saam 2 huisies deel.

Ag, ek het nog nooit so erg gewens ek is 'n onderwyser is nie! Ek en Lourie gaan volgende week vir hulle 'n gesondheidspraatjie gee. Lourie sal hulle vertel van tande borsel en ek sal iets vertel oor higiëne of pille of so-iets. Die hoof het ook gevra of ek nie kans sien om vir die kinders rekenaarlesse te gee nie (op my laptop!). So hou asseblief jul ou rekenars vir as daar weer 'n geleentheid kom!

Sien ook die foto waar ek in die klassie staan waarvoor ons hallo gaan sê het. Die een wat die foto moes neem het nog nooit 'n kamera gesien nie . . . so jul kan bly wees sommige van ons is op die foto!

The two boys on the photo do not have school uniforms and they have to share a pair of shoes! More than half of the 600 children in the school are orphans. The school has 10 teachers and 5 are student teachers! They also have no electricity and the teachers have to share 2 small houses.

Oh, how I wish I was a teacher! Next week Lourie and I are going to give a health talk. Lourie will talk on oral hygiene and I will teach something about hygiene or medicine. The head also asked if I could give some computer classes on my laptop! So please – do not throw your old computers away – maybe we can organise something for the school!

The one who took the photo of us in the class has never before seen a camera in his life! We are lucky that so many of us are on the photo!
