We often get questions about the project and what we do from day to day so we thought it would shed some more light if we answer some of the more frequently asked questions.

We left our professions six years ago and embarked on a "short outreach" to rural Zambia to manage an orphan project. Six years later and we are still caring for these children and we can testify in a big way of God's great love despite the fact that we only have very little support. **We do not get paid** to do what we do and are TOTALLY, TOTALLY dependent on donations from supporters. Every penny that is donated goes straight to the project... YOU have helped and supported more than 500 orphans in the past six years. We are currently working in Barotseland (West Zambia) to build a new base for OM with your HELP.

Lourie still does basic dental work in three nearby villages and I am also helping the community with basic healthcare.

With your donations this is what is being achieved; food and shelter, school fees, school uniforms, school shoes, books, stationary etc. (and also dental equipment, anaesthetics, etc.) while giving clothes and basic food to needy widows.

YOU have already helped six students to graduate from college and two more students are graduating this year.

You have helped to bring children from NOTHING, NOTHING, to having a future.

## The story of the orphan named Enock.....



Enock comes from a very poor family and became an orphan very early in his life. He had to "earn his keep" by working in the garden and helping his step-father with building work.

As a result of this poverty, Enock could not attend school as frequent as he wished...but HE WAS a very determined little boy!!! He came to us for help 6-years ago... and with financial help from supporters we managed to secure a place at a boarding school so that he could concentrate ONLY on his schoolwork and not worry about the hardships back home... Enock excelled at school and came to visit us, his foster parents; every holiday... he worked very hard, even during school holidays... Enock passed grade 12 with 3 distinctions and he also finished discipleship training through OM (Operation Mobilisation) in his gap year ..... and Enock now calls us mom and dad and he has an amazing close relationship with God!!

Enock Dobola will be the first from amongst his 35 siblings (and amongst the villagers of the Gamela-area!) to finish school and by the end of 2014 he will have earned a BSc-degree in environmental health at the Rusangu University in Zambia. He already has an offer from the Government Department of Health to start as a health inspector the following year.

THANKS to people with compassion towards these orphans..... Enock now has a bright future but sadly there are many others who may not get the chance that Enock has had without your continued support.

We just want to give God all the honour and glory!

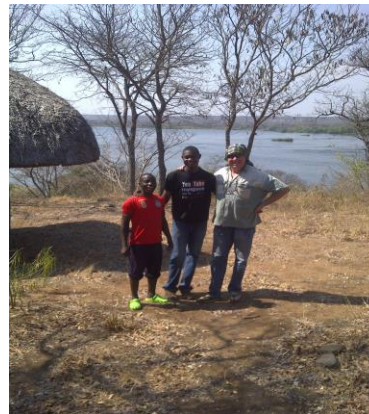
