### Projekte

Met die 'sweet cakes' gaan dit ook nog voor die wind. Hier regs onder, kom koop twee van ons jongste kliënte, Cynthia en Sharon, van die 'sweet cakes'. Ons gebruik die geld om onder andere skoolboeke en - uniforms aan te koop vir die laer standers.

Ons hoenders lê nou byna elke dag meer as 30 eiers en soms moet ons dit op die dorp gaan verkoop! Mary help my nou om 'sweet cakes' te bak, want almal van julle wat al hier gekuier het, weet dis 'n taak met geen einde nie! Mary, die pastoor se vrou, help ook om my vloere te poets, maar verder doen ek en Lourie al die huiswerk self. Sy is ook die een wat die winkeltjie eiehandig hanteer.

### Projects

Children in the higher grades are still coming to Kanjanji over weekends to help. In the photo on the left Lourie, Petias and Mordcay are getting cow manure for the vegetable gardens from the neighbouring village.

The sweet cakes are still in high demand and the next photo shows some of our youngest clients, Cynthia and Sharon, buying some. It is just too good to resist! Proceeds from the sweet cakes sales go towards school books and uniforms for the lower grades.

Mary, the pastor's wife, helps with the baking of the sweet cakes. Those of you who have visited Kanjanji in the past year, will know that it is a never ending task. Mary helps to wax our floors from time to time, but apart from that all the house work is done by Lourie and I. Mary is also the one who manages the little shop on her own.

On the next page is a photo of me fitting a new uniform for one of the boys from a nearby village. All their clothes and blankets were destroyed when their hut (as seen in the background) caught fire when one of the little ones played with a burning candle. We also donated some blankets, as the nights are still quite cold.

On the next picture you can see the new extension to the pastor's house. We are adding a small kitchen and another room to the existing house as well as a separate toilet and
