Projects and personal

Since we have arrived back in Choma it has been a mad rush to get all the children back to school and back to boarding. We are caring for 42 older children at the moment and we are also supporting around a hundred more children in the lower grades with school fees and food. We were running back and forth getting uniforms, books and basic groceries for the children going back to boarding school. Boarding school in Zambia is slightly different from what we are used to; maize meal is served three times a day! They only get meat or chicken once a week and two eggs are served once a week only. Over weekends they get buns and black tea. This is why we supply them with peanut butter, cordial and biscuits from time to time. Children in boarding are also not allowed to leave the premises during the term and mobile phones are not allowed either which is good but it creates a bit of a communication problem between the children and us. We have also realised with a shock that text books are not supplied at school and the problem is that you do not just walk into a shop and buy whatever you need. Text books are just not so freely available. We did manage to get some books and we can already see an improvement in the results. Kelvin, one of our children, had a 82% mark for one of his subjects. On the picture are Kelvin, Zulu and Austern at Choma Secondary School.

Last week we went to stay over at Kanjanji Camp for the weekend to celebrate Cholwe, one of our older children's birthday. Word spread fast and the next morning there were numerous children and adults coming to say hallo.

'n Lekker warm hello hier uit 'n mooi groen, maar baie warm Zambië! Kan byna nie glo dis alweer Februarie nie! Dis nou mango-tyd en ons eet mango's in alle vorms en voorbereidings! Ja, vir die van julle wat weet – dis ook mielie-tyd en wat is lekkerder as 'n groenmelie met botter op!? Hmmm!

Projekte en persoonlik

Sedert ons teruggekom het, was ons nogsteeds net besig om kinders in skole en koshuise te kry. Ons sorg vir 42 ouer kinders op die oomblik asook om en by 'n honderd kleineres- vir wie ons help met skoolfondse en kos. Dit is nou behalwe die rondvallery om uniforms, boeke, en basiese kruidiers te kry vir die kinders wat kosskool toe moet gaan. Nodeloos om te sê kosskool in Zambie is nie dieselfde as wat ons ken nie... Hier kry die kinders driemaal per dag mieliepap. Verder kry hulle slegs eenmaal per week vleis of hoender eenmaal per week 2 eiers. Gedurende naweke kry hulle „buns” en tee sonder melk of suiker. Dit is dan die rede waarom ons maar so nou en dan bietjie bydra met grondboontjiebotter, aanmaakkoeldrank en koekies. Die kinders mag glad nie die koshuis verlaat gedurende die termyn nie en hul mag ook glad nie selfone skool toe bring nie. Dit is dus 'n bietjie van 'n gesukkel om kontak te maak, maar ons het darem baie goeie verhoudings met die hoofde, dus kan die kinders in noodsituasies deur die hoof vir ons 'n boodskap stuur. Ons kom met 'n skok toe agter dat geen handboeke by skole voorsien word nie. Ons het nou begin om vir die hoër grade handboeke aan te koop, en ons kan alreeds 'n verskil in die resultate sien, een kind, Kelvin, het 82% gekry in sy laaste eksamen in graad 10! Links is die Kelvin, Zulu en Austern wat onderskeidelik in graad 11 en 12 is.

Ons het verlede week op uitnodiging van die pastoor 'n aand by Kanjanji Kamp gaan oorslaap om Cholwe se verjaardag te vier. Woord het vinnig versprei en toe ons die volgende oggend wakker word, was die wêreld vol kinders en mense om te kom groet! Links is klein Daniel wat nou graad 1 is.

On the picture you would see little Danny. Remember the little orphan who used to come to our door every morning for a slice of peanut butter bread and syrup. Well, he is in grade 1 now and he is so talkative he even greeted us with a very friendly "morning mummy, morning uncle"; that is the only English he knows!

Last Wednesday we left for Kabwe with five children going for Om's discipleship training. They were all so excited because Livingstone was previously the furthest they have been away from home. Because of lack of space we put them up in little tents on the lawn so there would not be any delays the next morning, for Kabwe is a seven hour journey from Choma. With our arrival in Kabwe everyone was running around to get settled in and the next moment Cholwe got stung by a wasp and his face started swelling up in no time. Fortunately we had some antihistamines and Cholwe could smile again. We want to thank everyone again who has been and still is involved in the lives of these children. You know that rippling effect when you toss a stone into water, it also touches other people's lives and it would be credited to your account. (Phillipians 4:17)

Die knaap het sleg gelyk, maar na paar antihistamiene, kon hy weer glimlag. Baie dankie vir julle almal wat deel het in hierdie kinders se lewens en veral die geleentheid wat hulle het om dissipelskap te doen. Julle weet dat die rimpels wat uitkring wanneer jy 'n klippe in die water gooi, ook ander mense se lewens aanraak en dit sal terugkom na jou. (Fillipense 4:17)
