Let our God get the glory for the whole effort and thanks again for everyone's effort and hard work!

The season has changed again and it is now delightfully cooler at night and still very mild during the day. Cholwe and Kelvin had been very busy with the knitting machine and they managed a record number of jerseys for the orphans. The two of them are also very busy teaching voluntarily at the two local schools as well as at the base. They are also tutoring grade 12-students who need extra help to rewrite some subjects next year. One of the boys, Eric, is also teaching the preschool class at the moment while he is trying to save up enough money to rewrite some subjects next year.

We were also very fortunate to have had some visitors at Zamulimu. Manie du Toit's Living Ball Group from George, S.A, came for a very welcome short outreach. We also had a quick visit from Ferdie Claase, one of the ministers at the SA Congregation in England, and his wife, Lizelle. Lourie and I had been members of this church for a number of years up to 2008. Their visit coincided so accurately with the arrival of the container and we were just too happy to have extra hands to help unload the huge container. Johan and Leonette Rossouw who had been steering the whole project with the help of Herman Bosman and others, had an amazing opportunity to get hold of second hand steel shelving so Lourie and the boys are now filling every available space with steel shelving. We also received a huge number of books and the aim is now to assist the local school to put up a library so the children could have more exposure to
