Projekte en persoonlik

Soos julle weet, was ons vir die Kersseisoen Suid-Afrika toe, en dit was 'n fees! Ons het lekker gekuier en net na Kersfees teruggekeer na Zambia toe. Terwyl ons in Pretoria was, het Jacques (op die foto links), wat 'n aptekerskollega van my is, vir ons al die "spoils" gegee. Dit is voorraad waarvan miskien net die etiket nat geword het of gevlek is. Links is ek en ma-Santie besig om al die honderde botteltjies medisyne in jerry-kanne leeg te maak, sodat ons dit kan terugvervoer na Zambia toe. Ons het altesaam 50 liter hoesmedisyne bymekaargemaak! Dit is 'n wonderlike geskenk omdat ons beplan om 'n mobiele eenheid op te rig, waarmee ons kan uitreike doen en dan ook sommer die weeskinders van mediese diense voorsien en natuurlik sal dit ook 'n voedingseenheid wees.

Groot nuus is dat vriende van ons van Engeland ons binnekort kom bystaan om so die projek verder uit te brei. Pieter en Joey Labuschagne, het ook opgepak en teruggekeer na Afrika toe. Pieter, wat 'n mediese dokter is en Joey, 'n praktykbestuurder, sal van onskatbare waarde wees vir die uitbreiding van die projek. Ons wens hulle alle sien en sterkte toe, waar hulle van die einde van hierdie maand eers die OM dissipelskapkursus gaan doen voordat hulle by ons aansluit.

Ek en Lourie het al groot planne begin maak om die mobiele eenheid op die been te kry en links is 'n ou voertuig wat ons na kyk om miskien in te rig vir die doel. "Olifant", soos dit genoem word, is baie vervalte en het baie werk nodig, maar dit is 'n begin en ons sal kyk of ons befondsing kry om dit te laat opdateer en inrig vir die gebruik as 'n mobiele kliniek.

The vehicle is called "Elephant" and we will just have to see whether it would be worth the time, money and effort to revive old "Elephant". Pieter is going to play a pivotal role with the mobile clinic, and we are so excited because two of the sponsored orphans are qualifying as nurses at the end of next year, and the agreement is that they would join the clinic for at least a year.
