When sending out the invitations everyone was made aware that all proceeds will go towards a vehicle for the Kanjanji Orphan Project. It is not always possible to thank everyone donating towards Kanjanji, through the newsletter, but this was an extraordinary sacrifice from these two special friends. Thank you so much!

The water level of the Zambezi has already started going down and after yet another disappointing rainy season the few local people who were so lucky to have some sort of a maize harvest, have brought in the harvest now but it would not be nearly enough to fill the tummies for a whole year.

We are looking forward to yet another consignment of goods from South Africa sponsored by the Rotary Club. Amongst other things there will also be two plastic agricultural tunnels which will enable us to have more control over all the pests and plagues in our vegetable garden. The aim is also to have enough vegetables to provide for the orphans and widows in the area.

Mupende, a young school boy from across the river has a remarkable story. It was brought to our attention that this boy puts in an extraordinary amount of effort to attend the ICT lessons at our base on Saturday mornings. He would cross the river in his dugout canoe with the ever present danger of angry hippos. He would then walk the 6km distance to the base for an hour long ICT lesson, just to tackle the return trip home again. How do you like that for sheer determination?

Johan en Leonette het verlede jaar 'n reuse partytjie vir hul verjaarsdae gereël en met behulp van hul twee seuns, Hanro en Leo, die 160-mense gesin-alleen onthaal. Die gaste is vooraf in kennis gestel dat die opbrengs van die onthaal spesifiek aangewend sal word vir 'n voertuig vir die Kanjanji Orphan Project. Dis nie altyd moontlik om vir elkeen se donasie dankie te sê deur die nuusbrieff nie, maar hierdie was regtig 'n uitsonderlike persoonlike opoffering wat julle gemaak het! Baie dankie, julle!!

Die rivier se vlak het al klaar begin sak en die paar mensies wat wel bietjie mielies kon oes, het dit nou van die landerye af, maar ons is bevrees dat dit nie die mae sal vul tot die volgende jaar nie!

Ons sien uit na 'n nuwe besending goedere vanaf Suid Afrika, geborg deur Rotary, wat onder andere 2-plastiektonnels insluit. Dit sal dit dan vir ons moontlik maak om groente te kweek met meer beheer oor peste en plaeg. William, een van ons weeskinders wat nou 'n gekwalifiseerde onderwyser is, is nou voltydse besig met die groentetuine, tot tyd-en-wyl hy 'n onderwysaanstelling kry. Ons poog om nie net in die basis se groentebehoefes te voorsien nie maar ook vir die weduwees en wese in die omgewing.

Julle moet Mupende, 'n jong seun van oorkant die rivier, se verhaal hoor! Ons het bewus geraak van die weeskind wat groot moeite doen om rekenaaronderrig te kom bywoon. Hy kruis die rivier met 'n kanoe elke Saterdag met die alomteenwoordige gevaar van moeilike seekoë en hy kan jou 'n paar vreesaanjaende stories vertel. Dan stap hy sowat 6-km vir 'n uur-lange rekenaaronderrig om dan maar net weer die terugtog aan te pak. Dit getuig van wilskrag en deursettingsvermoë!

In a previous newsletter we told you how the local primary school came first amongst twenty six other schools in last year's ICT-exam because we have ICT lessons on Saturdays for the grade 8's and 9's. Now Mupende was determined enough to do ICT that he got a transfer letter from his local school from across the river, so that he could enrol at our local school for ICT. After hearing his story we decided to accommodate him at the base just to make life easier for him and to realise his dream.

Enock, one of our orphans, who are qualifying as a health inspector (B.Sc Environmental Health) in September this year, is now doing his last three months of practical here in Sesheke. He is also doing his final essay at the local clinic on the effectiveness of local clinics concerning the delivery of babies.
