We greet you from a lush green Zambia. Yes, the first rains of the rainy season have arrived after the long months of drought we have had and the different hues of green must be seen to be believed. The Zambezi River is now at its lowest level and from where I am sitting now it looks like you could cross the 400-metre wide river in front of Kono Mulimo by foot, that is if you could avoid the crocodiles.

Personal and projects:

For those of you following us on FB, you would know that four of our children have now finished grade-12 and two of these boys have now joined us at Kono Mulimo. Zulu was head boy at Choma Secondary School while Austern was hostel captain. They are posing on the picture with their favourite shirts. All the other children are still busy writing exams and will soon be coming to join us from all over the country with public transport. We have moved the boys' beds into the "computer room" for the time being because the flimsy tents we are using cannot withstand a typical African thunderstorm. The quality is just not the same as that of the old army tents of yester year.

On the picture you would see Modi and Kelvin making beds for the boys since the "computer room" is not actually snake or rat proof. Remember we are only accommodating the older boys while the younger ones are still with their extended families in the village.

Lourie and I are really very busy in our "rural clinic" which is drawing local people from all over the community. Even I took the courage to have a wart on the index finger removed under local anaesthetic. On the picture you would see Lourie busy with yet another procedure with Kelvin assisting. A sort of homemade needle made from thick wire with a hook on one end slipped and bedded itself so deep in this boys thumb that Lourie had to remove it under local anaesthetic. Glad I did not have to assist with this gory one. Another woman arrived on our doorstep with third degree burns on her face after she tripped and fell into the open fire. We consulted dr. Pieter Labuschagne from South Africa over the phone and after prayer and days of treatment with

Soos baie van julle wat ons volg op Facebook weet is dat vier van ons kinders graad-12 voltooi het en dat twee van hulle nou by ons aangesluit het. Zulu, was hoofseun in Choma Secondary en Austern was koshuiskaptein. Links staan almal met hul geliefkoosde kleur hemp vir die foto! Al ons ander kinders is nou besig met eksamens en sal binnekort van heinde-en-ver met publieke vervoer kom kuier vir die vakansie. Ons het die seuns se beddens tydelik in die "rekenaarkamer" ingeskuif, omdat die tente wat ons gebruik nie opgewasse is teen Afrika-donderstorms nie. Ja, die tente is net nie meer van dieselfde kwaliteit en sterkte as die ou weermagtente waaraan ons gewoon was nie! Links is Kelvin en Modi besig om van "optelplanke" beddens te maak, want die "rekenaarkamer" is nou nie juis rot -en slangbestand nie! Onthou dat ons net die ouer weeskinders akkommodeer en dat die kleineres nog by hulle "extended families" in die villages bly.

Ons is baie bedrywig in ons "rural-kliniek" wat nou al meer bekend is in die gemeenskap. Selfs ek het deurgeloop nadat Lourie 'n reuse vrat, wat heetyd in die pad was op my wysvinger, uitgesny het. Links is Lourie besig met nog 'n prosedure met Kelvin as assistent. 'n Soort van naald, van dik draad gemaak, met 'n weerhaak op die punt het gegly en so diep in dié seun se duim beland dat Lourie moes verdoof en 'n redelike operasie uitvoer. Eina, ek hanteer maar eerder die kleiner gevalle en kindersiektes voordat ek by tande en operasies betrokke raak! Links is 'n vrou met derdegraadse brandwonde in die gesig nadat sy gestruikel en gesig eerste in die vuur beland het. Dr. Pieter Labuschagne, van Naboomspruit het oor die foon raad

all possible ointments and creams she came back to show us the miraculous healing. We almost could not believe this was the same woman and perfect healing took place. To God be the glory!!

In the mean time we had to drive all the way to Livingstone to try and repair what could possibly be repaired because we are now going through a terrible time where everything just seems to stop functioning. Our vehicle's clutch gave in, as well as the decoder, the borrowed trailer, and believe it or not, all three of the generators. Even my phone would just not switch on!
