Lourie het verlede jaar begin met "Farming God's Way" en alhoewel ons dit nie voluit kon doen nie, a.g.v. verskeie faktore, was die oes nog steeds baie suksesvol. Maar die feit bly staan – dit was 'n mooi oes en al die Villagers wil nou kom aanmeld vir die program. Wel, ons weet mos almal "sien is glo!"

Ons het die hammermeule wat die Kanadese kerk geskenk het, langs die kombuis aan die vloer vasgemessel en sal eersdaags begin mielies maal. Die "locals" kan nie wag nie want nou hoef hulle nie meer mielies met hulle stampers fyn te maal nie. Die wat nie kan betaal nie, sal betaal met 'n emmer mieliemeel wat dan na die weeshuis se stoor sal gaan.

Mary, die pastoor se vrou, wat die plaaslike winkeltjie vir ons bestuur, sal ook dan later weer van hierdie mieliemeel terug verkoop aan die "villagers". Ek en Mary het die winkeltjie vol voorraad gemaak en hier is sy besig om van die voorraad aan te ry na haar winkel. Op die volgende foto maak sy die "buns" wat sy ook in die winkel verkoop. Sy bak hierdie hele plaat in 'n tradisionele oond wat met 'n oop vuur werk.

Hello to you all

We want to thank everyone for all the messages of support with Lourie's dad's big heart bypass operation. It was a great success and he seems to be recovering well.

Projects and personal:

Last time we told you about everyone taking part in bringing in the maize harvest. It's all been done now and we think we had a rather good harvest considering that the fields had not been planted for the last few years. We managed to bring in 3 tons of maize from our postage stamp size farm which is great for Zambian standards. To be exact, it was 3.4 tons!

Lourie started with a programme called "Farming God's Way", which is very similar to Conservation Farming where you do not till your fields at all. The idea is not to disturb the micro cosmos in the upper parts of the soil and to keep the organic material, which accumulates on the surface, intact. The layer of organic material on the surface is called "God's blanket" and serve more than one purpose like keeping the moisture inside and to create compost for the following years.

The hammer mill is almost operational and the villagers cannot wait because that would mean the end of the laborious task, to pound their maize. Those who do not have cash, would pay with a bucket of maize, which would then go to our store room. That would then be used, when times get tougher round the end of the dry season when a lot of villagers would have depleted their supply of maize.

Mary, who runs our little shop, would then sell the maize back to the ones in need. On the picture Mary is getting stock for the shop and the other picture shows Mary getting
